
## June Meeting: Workshops (June 3 & 4)

#### A Counted Canvas Design

Stitched with *Gumnut Yarns* "Aztecs" stranded silk, "Jewels" perle silk, "Opals" silk & wool, "Moonbeams" mohair and "Gemstones" wool, and *Kreinik* #8 Braid



Design size: 4 3/8" x 4 3/8" on 18 mono canvas Shown in Garnet colorway Alternate colorways: Turquoise Sapphire Amethyst Emerald Can also be stitched in the Daphne colorways: Topaz Agate Jasper Jade Ruby

As usual, this picture does not do the piece justice as it is much more beautiful in person. Watch for news of the second class, a design that is still in progress.
