#### **Program:** "Choosing Threads for a Painted Canvas" -- Judie Solomon

Because this is our Annual Meeting, we have planned a special day. Judie will introduce us to new fibers, explain color choices and have advice on suggested stitches and patterns. Even if you do not stitch painted canvases, you can apply what you will learn from this exercise to other types of embroidery.

Judie and her staff will select threads that they think will enhance each of several canvases, choosing from a wide variety of threads and colors, solids and over-dyed or hand-dyed threads, always including lots of textures. Each attendee will be given a canvas, and all of the threads will be placed in a pile on the table. Then the fun begins. Each person gets to solve the puzzle of which threads were intended for her canvas. After trades and bartering, we will go around the table and review what was chosen versus what Judie had selected and discuss the pros and cons of each choice. At this time we can also talk about suggested stitches and finishing ideas for each canvas.

When our discussion is over, we will share items brought for show and tell, and hold a very short meeting to elect officers for the 2006-2008 term.

After the meeting, we will go out to lunch at the Buckingham Restaurant, a short ride from the store. You may have a salad, a choice of four entrees, dessert, and coffee or tea. Wine may be purchased separately if you wish. A description of the entrees follows:

**Veal Marsala** - veal sautéed in butter and swirled in Marsala wine with fresh sliced mushrooms **Citrus Chicken** - chicken sautéed with herbs, orange and lemon with a touch of honey **Stuffed Filet of Sole** - filet of sole with crabmeat stuffing

#### **A Counted Canvas Design**

Stitched with *Gumnut Yarns* "Aztecs" stranded silk, "Jewels" perle silk, "Opals" silk & wool, "Moonbeams" mohair and "Gemstones" wool, and *Kreinik* #8 Braid



Design size: 5" x 5" on 18 mono canvas

Shown in Topaz colorway

#### **Fantasy Remembered**

#### Fantasy Remembered Luan Callery

Stumpwork is the art of raised embroidery. In this piece the twisting vine holds many dimensional fruits of fancy. Included are padded and wired leaves, raised fruit and wrapped berries. Some of the fruit is padded and stitched directly onto the linen, while others are worked on another fabric, called a slip, embellished with beads and later appliquéd to the linen using self-fabric for the padding. Beads are wrapped with stranded cotton and a short stem is added before attaching to the vine. A dragonfly with iridescent wings and a beaded tail gracefully hovers above while a little spider carefully spins its web among the fauna. Stitches used are couching and buttonhole, outline, french knots, lazy daisy, split and satin, and long and short shading. If you have had difficulty executing your shading stitches as well as you would like, follow the exercises in this course and learn the technique of blending with long and short stitches.

Type of project: framed picture

Size: 6" x 12"

Fabric: plain weave linen/linen twill

Threads: Medici wool, cotton floss, rayon, beads

Color: values of green, lavender, pink and blue, or students choice.

Skill level: intermediate to advanced

Prerequisites: knowledge of long and short shading
