Friday & Saturday, June 6th & 7th

"My Thoughts of Spring Band Sampler" – Catherine Theron
(A Foley/Cornelius Teacher)

Create a 17th century inspired counted thread band sampler using silk flosses in rich shades of red, green, gold, blue and brown. This sampler measures 5" x 30" and is worked on 35-count cream linen.

Stitches used include Double Running, Long-Arm Cross, Montenegrin, Diagonal Cross, Satin, Queen, Diagonal Queen, Upright Cross, Algerian Eye, Double Straight Cross, Gobelin, Smyrna Cross, Cross-Stitch Over One, Four-Sided, Chain, Diamond Eyelet, Padded Satin, Buttonhole Bar, Detached Buttonhole, Spiral Trellis, Palestrina Knots and Bullion Knots.

The top section of this rich, textured piece features polychromatic bands with strawberries and flowers. The saying "How blest is she among the fair by gentlest stars inclined, who cherishes with love sincere the virtues of the mind" is interspersed between the bands.

The bottom section of this sampler is monochromatic and is worked using two weights of cream silk to enhance the texture and design.

This piece is recommended for the intermediate to advanced counted thread student. There is no pre-work or prerequisites required.

Here are directions to Duncaster: (Official address is 40 Loeffler Road, Bloomfield, CT)
(follow signs to the Aquatic Center)

From Rt. 84 Westbound [from Manchester]:

*Take Rt. 291, exit 61. Follow Rt. 291 to Rt. 218 exit. Take left onto Rt. 218. Follow for about 3 miles. Take right onto Rt. 189 and follow to the center of Bloomfield. Take a left on Rt. 178. Continue straight on Rt. 178 for 1.4 miles. To use the new front entrance, turn right onto Mountain Avenue and continue approx. ½ mile to entrance on the left into Duncaster. From the Loeffler Road entrance or the Mountain Avenue entrance, once on the campus, **visitors should follow the signs to the Aquatics & Fitness Center Entrance. Our meeting takes place in the conference room one floor above the entrance level (4th floor).***

From Rt. 84 Eastbound [from Farmington]:

*Take exit 41. Go left on South Main Street [which becomes North Main Street at West Hartford Center] for 4.6 miles to Rt. 185. Turn left on Rt. 185 for 1.8 miles. Turn right on Rt. 178. To use the new front entrance, after about ½ mile turn left onto Mountain Avenue and continue approx. ½ mile to entrance on the left into Duncaster. From the Loeffler Road entrance or the Mountain Avenue entrance, once on the campus, **visitors should follow the signs to the Aquatics & Fitness Center Entrance. Our meeting takes place in the conference room one floor above the entrance level (4th floor).***

From Rt. 91 [North or South]:

*Take exit 36. Go west on Rt. 178 for 4.5 miles to the center of Bloomfield. At the traffic light continue straight on Rt. 178 for 1.4 miles. To use the new front entrance, turn right onto Mountain Avenue and continue approx. ½ mile to entrance on the left into Duncaster. From the Loeffler Road entrance or the Mountain Avenue entrance, once on the campus, **visitors should follow the signs to the Aquatics & Fitness Center Entrance. Our meeting takes place in the conference room one floor above the entrance level (4th floor).***

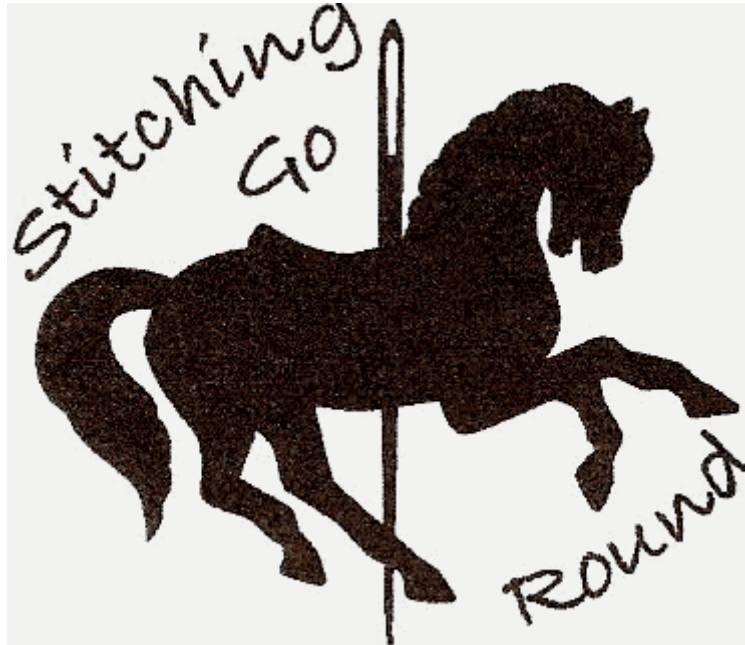

Poppies taught by Luan Callery

***Poppies* (Teacher: Luan Callery)**

Inspired by the colors of summer, and using Appleton Wool to capture the feel of these vibrant crewel flowers, *Poppies* takes a modern approach to a traditional needlework technique, creating a floral design that is simple and pleasing to any taste.

As embroidery is an individualized art, so should color and texture be. You may select purple, red, yellow, or whatever color you fancy. Four different color combinations are listed but you are encouraged to choose your favorite. Ground fabric can be moiré as shown or a closely woven fabric. Guidelines are provided to help you create a piece suitable to your unique style.

This crewel piece uses thread painting techniques to accent the shadows and add depth. Appleton is medium-weight crewel wool with a loft making it quite forgiving - very helpful for those who fear long and short shading. To further help achieve success, diagrams are provided throughout the text to guide the direction of your stitches.

Long and short is the primary stitch used to blend the various hues of the petals. Long split stitches make up the stems. Fine details are completed with back stitches, seeding, and bullion knots in DMC floss.

Project: Poppies (Framed Piece)

Size: 5" x 5"

Fabric: Off white moiré and muslin, 12" x 12"

Threads: Appleton crewel wool, DMC cotton embroidery floss

Colors: Green, blue, yellow, rust, and poppy in red oranges; alternatives available for yellow, purple, or red/pink poppies

Proficiency Level: Intermediate/advanced

Prerequisites: Knowledge of long and short shading desirable

Time: Six months

Supplies (approximate): \$25.00
