Saturday, October 15th - Textile Tour, Lunch &/or Bargello Balls

We have an exciting opportunity for a private textile tour at the Webb-Deane-Stevens Museum in Wethersfield. "**Textile Treasures**" is being offered to the public on select Saturdays in June, August and October, but they are willing to let us come on **Saturday**, **October 15**th to get a rare behind-the-scenes view of this historic and well-preserved collection at **10 a.m.** on that date.

When textile and costume expert Lynne Bassett was invited to consult on a new textile tour at the Webb-Deane-Stevens (WDS) Museum, she was genuinely surprised at the quality of the collection. There, among the brilliantly colored and richly detailed clothing, shoes, and linens dating from the 1690s to mid-1800s, lay several Sarah Noyes Chester crewelwork pieces. To put that into perspective, Chester's crewelwork bed cover, part of the same set, is at The Metropolitan Museum of Art.

Among the favorites of curators Lynne Bassett and Richard Malley are an exquisitely detailed man's crewel purse dated 1759; a luxurious crewel christening robe; whole-cloth worsted quilts; a quilted red petticoat; and 18th century men's clothing attributed to Jeremiah Wadsworth. While costumed guides show off some of the museum's most prized possessions, they will discuss the home as source of textile production, domestic labor, and textiles as an indicator of wealth/social states.

You may sign up for the tour at 10, and/or lunch at a nearby restaurant at about 12:30, and/or "Creating Bargello Balls" at Thistle Needleworks at around 2.

If you do plan to join us for the tour, please be there several minutes before 10 as the tour begins at 10 a.m.

Creating Bargello Balls


Meet at Thistle Needleworks at 2 p.m.

Create a beautiful Christmas ornament, or just a happy hanging for the chandelier or a window. Have you seen the balls that are all the rage by home decorators that are placed strategically on a table or mantle? You can make a very special one that will be the highlight of a grouping in your home.

Workshop participants will provide **five full skeins** of cotton embroidery floss in the color of their choice -- four values of the same color, very dark to very light; **two skeins of the darkest value** and one skein each of the others -- one card of FyreWerks or **10 meters** of Balger 1/8" ribbon to coordinate, 7" x 12" stretcher bars, embroidery scissors, a laying tool, and magnification and/or light, if needed. Your kit will include a 7" x 12" piece of 18-mesh canvas, a #22 tapestry needle, a Styrofoam ball for the finishing, and full instructions for both the stitching and finishing.

From Hartford and Points North: Take Interstate 91 south to Exit 26 (Old Wethersfield). It is four miles south of the intersection of Interstates 84 and 91 in downtown Hartford. Follow the prominent brown signs for the Webb and Deane Houses. When you arrive at the intersection in the center of Old Wethersfield, take a left on Main Street. The museum is one block on the right side of the street. **From New Haven and Points South:** Take Interstate 91 North to Exit 26 and follow the signs to the houses in the center of Old Wethersfield.

From the West: Take Interstate 84 east past Waterbury to 691 east. From the left lane, exit to Interstate 91 north.

From the East: Take Interstate 84 west to Interstate 91 south.

Parking: Car parking is available at no charge on Main Street in front of the museum or in the parking lot behind the Keeney Memorial Center directly across the street.

Seabury's Address: 200 Seabury Drive, Bloomfield, CT 06002

From Points North and Bradley International Airport:

Take I-91 South to Exit 36, Bloomfield-Rte 178 West (Park Avenue). Turn right at end of exit ramp onto Rte 178 West. It is 2.6 miles to Seabury.

*Continue to follow Rte 178 West. At the intersection of Rte 187 (Blue Hills Ave. First Cathedral is located at this intersection on left), continue straight. This is now Wintonbury Avenue. Landmarks are the Seabury At Home office on your right, and Bloomfield United Methodist Church on your left. At fork, bear right to stay on Wintonbury Avenue. Seabury is on the right. *Note: Take the second entrance, which is the Main Entrance. The first entrance will bring you to Seabury Meadows, our Memory Support Center.

From Points South:

Take I-91 North to Exit 36, Bloomfield Rte 178 West (Park Avenue). Turn left at end of exit ramp onto Rte 178 West and follow the directions above from asterisk (*). Seabury is 2.6 miles from Exit 36.

From Points East:

Take Mass Pike (Rte 90) to Exit 9 Hartford New York City Sturbridge Rtes 84 & 20. After toll booths, bear left, following signs for Rte 84 West, Hartford, CT. Take Exit 61 onto Rte 291 West Windsor. Note: The exits in this area are out of sequence. Exits 62 & 60 Buckland St Middle Turnpike West will appear before Exit 61. Take Exit 2B Springfield I-91 North. From I-91 North, take Exit 36, Bloomfield Rte 178 West (Park Avenue). Turn left at end of exit ramp onto Rte 178 West and follow the directions above from asterisk (*). Seabury is 2.6 miles from Exit 36.

Alternate Route From Points East: Take Mass Pike to Exit 6 Springfield/Chicopee Rte 91. Follow signs for I-91 South. Take Exit 36 off I-91 South Bloomfield/Rte 178 West (Park Avenue). Turn right at end of exit ramp onto Rte 178 West and follow the directions above from asterisk (*).

From Points West:

Take Rte I-84 East to Rte 91-North and follow directions above for access from Points South. From Litchfield County, follow Rte 202 to Rte 44. Travel East on Rte 44 to Bishop's Corner in West Hartford, CT. Turn left onto North Main Street and follow directions below from the double asterisk (**).

Local Access to Seabury:

Access South Main Street-West Hartford from Rte 84 or other local roads. Travel on South Main Street, heading North. This will take you through West Hartford Center and Bishop's Corner Shopping Plaza. Cross Rte 44 (Albany Avenue) at Bishop's Corner and continue straight. The road is now called North Main Street. **Continue straight, cross the intersection of Rte 185 (Simsbury Road), past Cigna Insurance Corp, to the intersection of Rte 189 and Rte 218. Turn left onto Rte 189 North (Bloomfield Avenue) and travel to Bloomfield Center. In the center of Bloomfield, at the intersection of Rte 178 go straight on Rte 189 (Bloomfield Avenue) to the next stop light. Turn right onto Wintonbury Avenue. There will be a white Congregational Church at this turn. Stay on Wintonbury Avenue through 2 traffic lights until you reach your first stop sign. Turn right at the stop sign to stay on Wintonbury Avenue. Seabury is 3/4 of a mile on the left.



"My Peaceable Kingdom" Sampler - Catherine Theron and Studio Time Opportunity



Worked on 30-count vanilla linen, this lovely, "peaceable" sampler will provide hours of pleasurable stitching. The top section features a lady in her garden complete with dogs, lilacs and bee skeps. The center has a colonial home reminiscent of the houses in Williamsburg, VA, "alphabet trees", a family, pets and plenty of birds. The center bottom area has an over-1 village scene surrounded by the wild woods and various woodland creatures. The piece is outlined by a flowing strawberry border.

Stitches used include long arm cross, Smyrna cross, stem, diagonal satin, padded satin, petit point, colonial knot, straight, spiral trellis and several others.

A myriad of colorful silk and cotton threads are used to create this scene. All threads are included in your kit.

Finished size is $17 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $19 \frac{1}{2}$ ".

Time: Class will take place from 9:30 to 4:30 pm

ISABELLA – ITALIAN DRAWN THREAD By Barbara Kershaw

This course continues your exploration of the wonderful technique of Italian style drawn thread. The project has been designed as a decorative hand towel but could easily be converted into a placemat, tablemat, or even a table runner by using a longer piece of linen. There are six decorative bands across the towel, three of which require withdrawing threads using two different methods. This course teaches the art of knotting bundles both in a straight line and in a curving line that undulates across the band. A simple dove's eye pattern is worked in band two on the straight lacing while a needlework fan pattern is worked between the undulating knotted threads of band six. Although this is an advanced level course, if you are familiar with withdrawing threads and want to explore and expand your knowledge and ability it is an ideal place to start. Left-handed instructions are available on request.

Project: Ornamental Hand Towel or Table Runner Size: Approximately 12" x 19 1/4" (30.5cm x 49 cm)

Proficiency Level: Advanced

Prerequisites: A knowledge of drawn thread would be advantageous.

Time: Six-lesson course estimated to take six months.

Text: 46 pages

Supplies: (approximate): \$35, include 32-count Belfast linen, white Coton Perle, white cotton floss (see
