Count-Down to CRVC at the Durham Fair!

As you know, we have been asked by the Needlework Department of the Durham Fair to have a presence there this year, September 26-29. We are planning stitch-ins from 3-6 pm on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, and individual members can enter pieces finished in the last 3 years as exhibits.

For the stitch-ins, we will have a 2-person team there every day. We will assign teams to particular days at the Sept. 10 Board meeting at Thistle Needleworks. If you are certain you can be at the Fair and want to be on a team, but can't make it to the Board meeting, email me with your preferred day at hglord@cox.net by Sunday Sept. 8. Teams will be supplied with stuff to hand out and signage, and should bring a couple of finished pieces in different techniques for display and as conversation starters. Anybody who isn't able to commit ahead of time but wants to participate can just show up with something to stitch and hang out as long as they are able to. The Needlework building is near the center of the fairgrounds.

For entering as an exhibitor, here is a link to the needlework page with all the categories and requirements: www.durhamfair.com/exhibitors/needlework. This covers all needlework; embroidery is listed under "Hand Embroidery" and "Wall Hangings." You need to register by Sept. 14, and drop off articles at the Fair on Sept. 21 between 10 am and 4 pm. (one person can drop off other people's entries). Exhibitor Entry is free -- Cash prizes and ribbons are awarded -- Items are displayed in a secure, dry building -- Exhibitors are eligible to purchase a reduced 4 day entrance pass to the fair on the day they drop off their exhibits.

Since the chapter will pay for your fabric, please note on the sign-up form what color you would like so that it can be cut before class or choose your fabric ahead of time and let the clerks know that the cost of your fabric is to be charged to CRVC. There are many colors available, but only a few will be listed on the form.



This design by Ann-Marie Anderson-Mayes at www.beautifulstitches.com.au is offered as a gift to all stitchers. It is a great way to experiment with a range of canvaswork stitches using variegated thread and three coordinating solid colors. It will work beautifully as a bookmark, as decoration on a journal cover, or perhaps as a beautiful accent on a small handbag or iPad cover. We will supply the fabric and the directions, but you get to choose your colors, from your stash or at the store.

Here is some information from the instructions:

To complete this embroidery you will need:

Congress canvas measuring at least 12×28 cm = 4.7 in. $\times 11$ in. (this will give you a minimum of 3cm (1.2 in) extra fabric all around the stitched area which measures 6×21.5 cm (2.4" $\times 8.5$ ").

Size 24 tapestry needle

Small, sharp embroidery scissors

Your preferred embroidery frame (I like Q-snaps but please feel free to use your favourite framing system)

Embroidery threads: This project is ideally suited to choosing your own threads. I have included the threads I used, but you won't be able to replicate them exactly as the variegated silk is a one-off that I dyed myself. Choosing your own colours is very easy. All you need is a variegated thread and three coordinating solid colours. You can use stranded silks, cottons or a combination -- they will be equally effective. And your colour choices might transform this into Spring Fireworks or Beach Fireworks. The creative decisions are in your very capable hands. :)

Name Used In These Notes My Colour Your Colour

Variegated My own hand dyed thread -

12 strand silk (red, yellow, green combination)

Colour 1 Threadworx 10051 - 6 strand cotton (red)
Colour 2 Au Ver a Soie No. 2533 - 7 strand silk (yellow)
Colour 3 Au Ver a Soie No. 2125 - 7 strand silk (green)

Saturday, December 7th, 2019 "Elegant Diamond" Box Designed by Denise Pratt



At this meeting we will begin to stitch this beautiful box, following Denise's clear diagrams and directions. She will prepare colors for the kits based on your preferences as noted on the registration coupon with lots of possibilities, not just those shown above. The primary diamond color is worked in variegated floss weight silk, such as Waterlilies or Silk 'n Colors, and the effects are so much fun to produce. It may happen that we construct the box at the February meeting, unless you need to complete it as a holiday gift.

New Group Correspondence Course White Iris by Mona Hill

Registration Deadline: Nov. 15, 2019

On this Group Correspondence Course you will stitch this stunning **White Iris** using white or cream Pearl Cotton on matching 32-count Belfast linen. The mat chosen for behind and around the piece adds the punch of color. Combining stunning June flowers, White Iris is a sampler of eleven **pulled thread patterns** worked inside surface embroidery of flowers petal edges. The surface embroidery emphasizes shaping the buttonhole stitch and the chain stitch to form leaves and petal edges. Chain stitch, outline stitch and satin stitch variations are used for flower stems. Some knowledge of compensation is essential in working the pulled thread patterns. This beautiful composition, done in surface embroidery enclosing areas filled with pulled thread patterns, has a spectacular lace-like quality.



Size: 9" x 9" design on 15" x 15" ground fabric

Fabric: 32-count Belfast linen **Threads:** Pearl cotton #8 and #12

Colors: White or cream **Skill Level:** intermediate

Prerequisites: Knowledge of compensation and the ability to work stitches from diagrams

Text: \$48 per student

Supplies: \$19.00 (approximate)

The cost of the class is \$58.00, which includes the \$48.00 text fee and the \$10.00 postage fee. Registration deadline is Nov. 15, 2019. Registration will be sent to National shortly thereafter. Booklets will be received by the group leader approximately 8 to 10 weeks after that. The group leader will notify you of the end date. This is a six month course.
