Saturday, June 5th, 2021 Zoom class with Susan Hoekstra - "Thread for All Seasons"

"Thread For All Seasons" offers a chance to work with the design color of your choice. There are three color options from which to choose: Seasons, Jewel and Spring! After this exercise, you will better understand how colors work together and how colors work off each other. This exercise will be a real eye opener! Registrations for this class are closed.

"Thread For All Seasons" is stitched on 18-count canvas measuring 9" \times 9". The finished size of this delightfully colorful piece is 6" \times 6".

Class Objectives:

Learning how canvas color and threads work together is important for anyone doing needlepoint. In the piece "Thread For All Seasons" the stitcher has the opportunity to delve deeper into this relationship. The stitcher will pick out which painted canvas they like (from three color choices). A stitch guide is provided. Come play with this design, challenge your sense of color and work outside your box! Join the color revolution!

At this time we hope that this meeting will take place in person at <u>Thistle Needleworks</u>. There are several copies of the same crewel kits that were donated for our use. We plan to give one to each participant with the hope each person will interpret it with their own choices of stitches and colors. Judie Solomon will review a variety of crewel stitches and their execution. The plan is that each of us will bring her piece to the December meeting so that we can share our individual approaches. Supplies for a sample kit are shown below.



During the afternoon, supplies and instructions will be available for choosing a Rozashi project and kitting up the threads and fabrics needed to complete the project. We will prepare the Ro (fabric) by gluing it to an appropriate frame so that you are set to begin the stitching. The instructions are projects designed and taught by Ginny Currie, and the materials are available because of her donation to our chapter. Our aim is to share the chosen projects at the February meeting.

TEACHING OUR YOUTH STITCHING (T.O.Y.S.)

The NER-EGA Board discussed and most agreed that the T.O.Y.S. program be made available to chapters that are teaching embroidery to youth.

Each project is designed to encourage creativity, contains teaching guidelines, including supplies and equipment needed, the appropriate stitch diagrams, and photos of stitched examples. Each has been taught to adults who in turn have held sessions with youth. The youth classes also have been taught and include photos of project they stitched.

YOUTH EMBROIDERY CLASSES — Lesson Plans – available electronically

Draw, Paint, Stitch – Surface Stitches. Using photographs and drawings for designs and transferring designs

Create a Family Crest – Surface Stitches – Designing a family crest

Counting Stitches – On canvas – A Sampler – Designing sampler, Alphabet and motif charts

Finishing Your Project – Instructions on framing, a bracelet, book covers, pins, and pillow

Fun Ideas—Pick A Card – each card features a stitch with photo of project using that stitch on front and the stitch diagram on back and Creating designs by Make a Line and Cut and Arrange Shapes
